Part D: January Programs and Initiatives

1. Feminine Hygiene Products Donations

I. Onboarding of New Schools:

- In January we successfully onboarded four new schools.
- The onboarded schools will now benefit from feminine hygiene products and career mentorship programs.
- Below is a breakdown of the onboarding:

II. Restocking of Partner Schools:

- In January, we restocked feminine hygiene products in five partner schools, ensuring continued access to essential resources for menstrual hygiene management.
- January marked the beginning of a new academic year resulting in changes in student population across our partner schools due to students advancing to next education levels e.g. Form One admission and form fours progression to universities.

- We will continue to collaborate with **Keeping A Girl in School (Usikuemshy)** and other like-minded organizations to expand our reach and impact in promoting girls' education and well-being.
