Part A: Overview and Highlights

In May 2024, Superior Homes Foundation continued its mission of empowering young girls despite the challenges posed by the late reopening of schools due to heavy rains and floods affecting various parts of the country. We remained dedicated to our mission of empowerment through education by expanding our reach with the addition of:

1. **Four** new schools: **Kinaanie Primary School, St. Albertina Kiongwani Girls Secondary School, Kasambara Primary School, and Athi River Primary School.**
2. These four schools represent **1,880** new girls that we will support on a monthly basis.
3. Additionally, **three** impactful mentorship sessions were conducted at **Sultan Hamud Primary, K.M.C D.E.B. Primary School, and Kasambara Primary School.**
4. We also extended our support through sanitary pad donations to various institutions aiding flood victims and needy orphan children.

1. Feminine Hygiene Products Donations
