Part A: Overview and Highlights

In June 2024, Superior Homes Foundation continued its mission of empowering young girls through education by expanding its reach and impact. Our June highlights are as follows:

1. Addition of **Four** new schools: **Kapecha Primary School, Green Olives Secondary School, Kavuko Primary School, and St Paul’s Primary School.**
2. These four schools represent **750** new girls that we will support on a monthly basis.
3. Additionally, **three** impactful mentorship sessions were conducted at **Pingilikani Primary and Secondary Schools, St Albertina Kiongwani Girls Secondary School, and Kariandusi Primary School.**
4. We partnered with **Sciences for Development of Girls** for a mentorship session at Pingilikani Primary and Secondary schools.
5. We also extended our support through sanitary pad donations to **Mercy’s Light Family** an institution located in Vipingo that supports teen girls/moms who have gone through sexual trauma with vocational and life skills training.
6. The Foundation also supported a student at Thugunui Primary with 100days worth of adult diapers that will aid in keeping her in school consistently.

1. Feminine Hygiene Products Donations

I. Onboarding of New Schools:

- In June we successfully onboarded **four** new schools. One of which; **Green Olives Secondary**, was a recommendation from one of our suppliers, **Flogalo Limited**.
- The onboarded schools will now benefit from feminine hygiene products and mentorship sessions.
