In July 2024, Superior Homes Foundation continued its mission of empowering young girls through education by expanding its reach and impact. Our July highlights are as follows:

- 1. Addition of Four new schools: Kwakathule Secondary School, Ngwata Primary School, Katani Secondary School, and Maiani Girls High School.
- 2. These four schools represent **1,632** new girls that we will support on a monthly basis.
- 3. Additionally, **three** impactful mentorship sessions were conducted at **Kwale Primary Schools, Maiani Girls Secondary School,** and **Katani Secondary School**.
- 4. We partnered with *Mavoko Subcounty* for a school health program at Katani Secondary as well as *Keeping a Girl in School* for a menstrual Hygiene session at Kwale Primary school.
