In July 2025, Superior Homes Foundation proudly advanced its mission to keep girls in school, making it one of our most impactful months yet.

Key highlights from the month include:

- 1. Successfully restocked sanitary pads across all 34 partner schools in all our counties of operation.
- 2. Onboarded 18 new schools and reached an additional 5,223 girls.
- 3. Expanded our presence to Kiambu County, with 11 new schools now part of the Foundation.
- 4. Delivered 6 mentorship sessions, continuing our commitment to holistic support.
