Part A: Overview and Highlights:

In July 2025, Superior Homes Foundation proudly advanced its mission to keep girls in school, making it one of our most impactful months yet.

Key highlights from the month include:

1. Successfully restocked sanitary pads across all 34 partner schools in all our counties of operation.
2. Onboarded 18 new schools and reached an additional 5,223 girls.
3. Expanded our presence to Kiambu County, with 11 new schools now part of the Foundation.
4. Delivered 6 mentorship sessions, continuing our commitment to holistic support.
